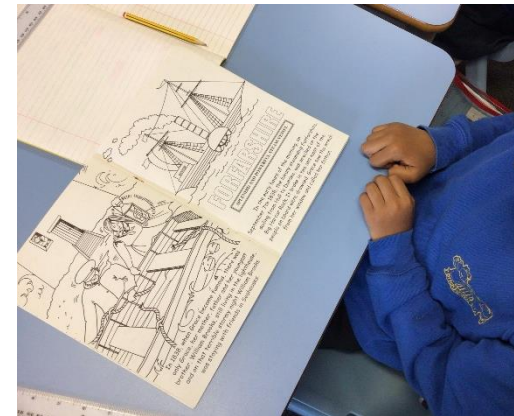
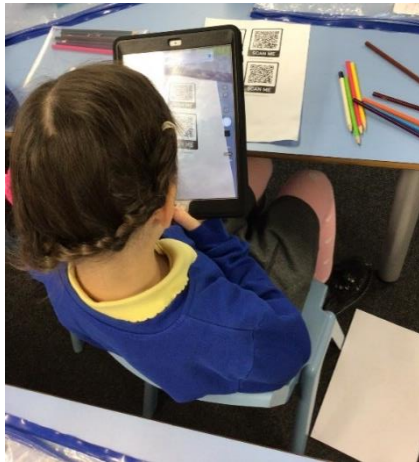

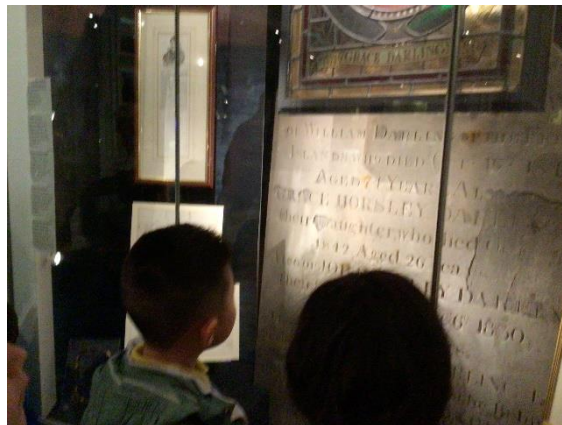
How did the story of Grace Darling impact upon the role of a sea rescuer today?

Beginning of the process



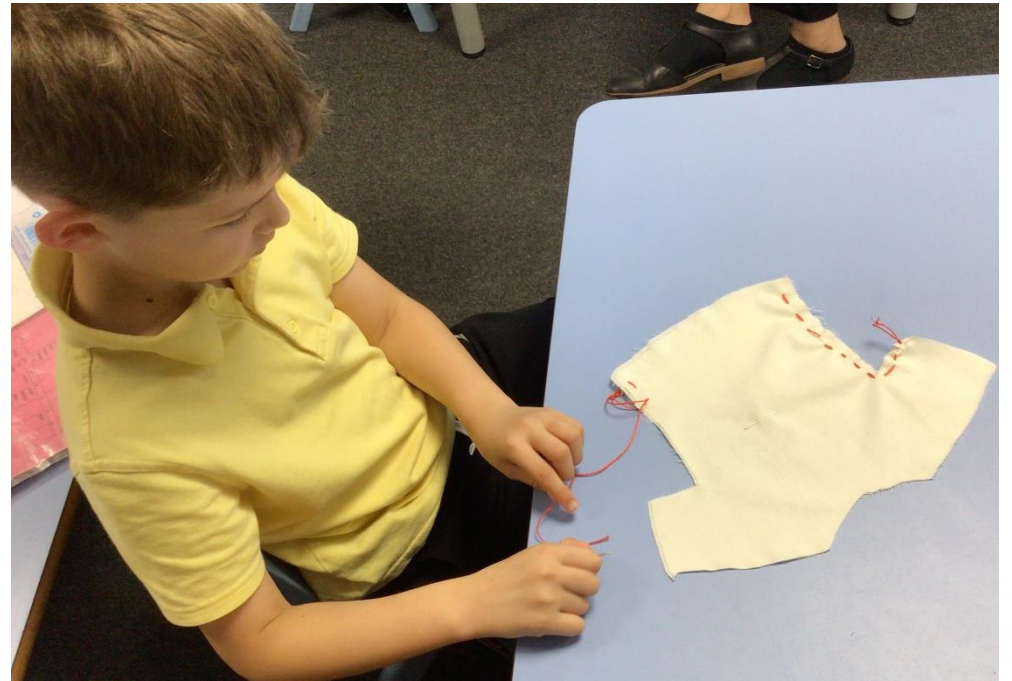

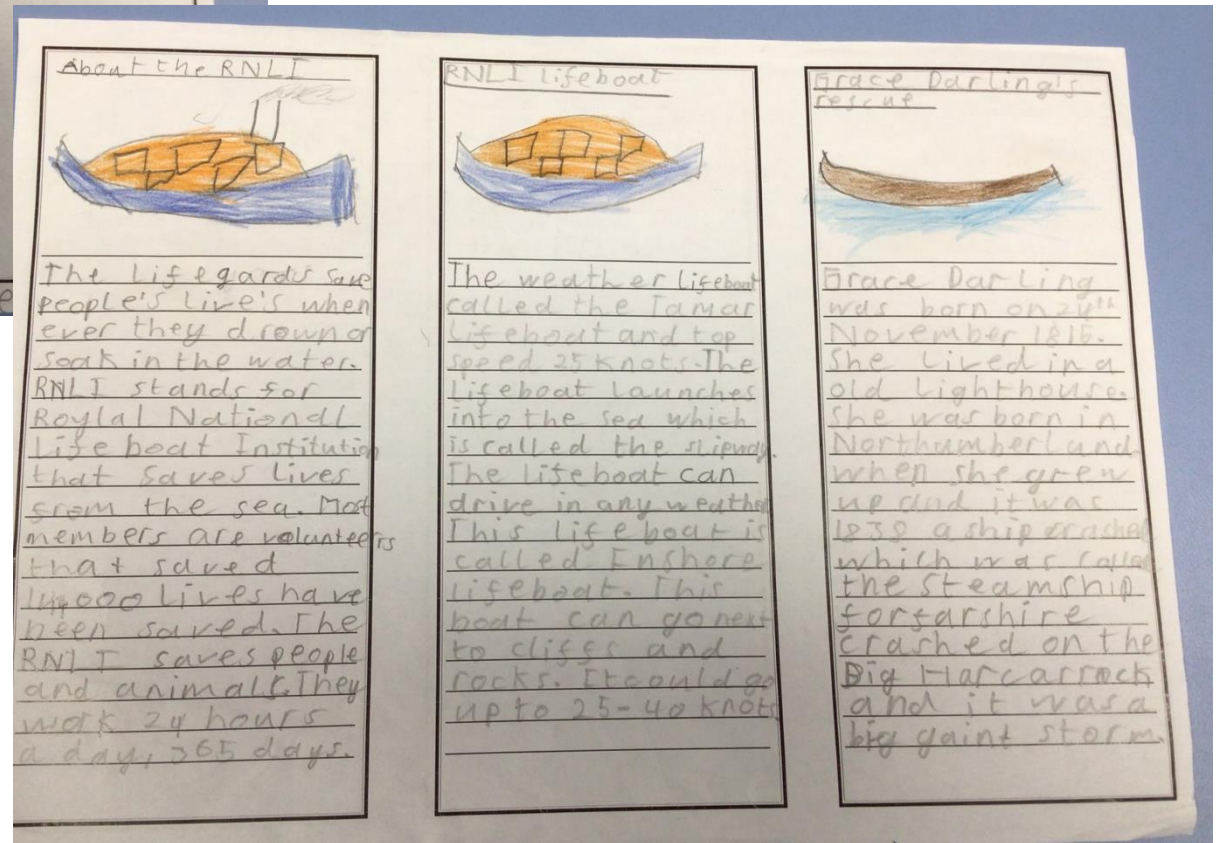
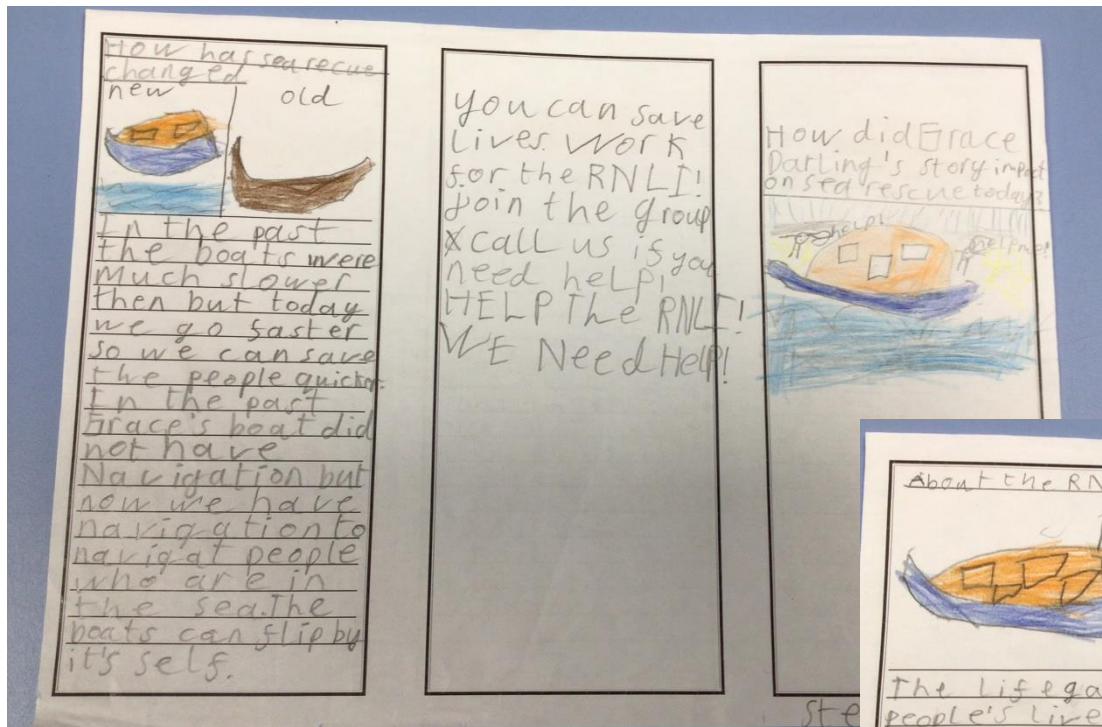




We showed our parents/carers what we had found out by presenting our findings in a class assembly. Great oracy skills were shown.



We presented our findings in a leaflet to encourage other children to consider a career working for the RNLI.



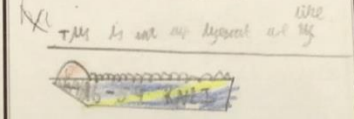
How has sea rescue changed?

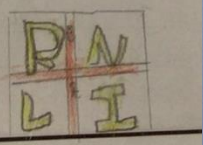

RNLi lifeboats

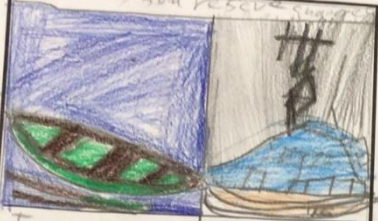


All weather lifeboats

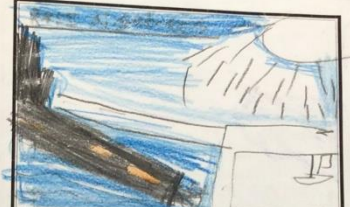
