## SOME REMINDERS

Start of the day - Both Year 2 classes start at 8.45am.

The children come into school via the gate on the top yard at **8.40am** and walk to the classrooms by themselves. Please ensure that your child arrives on time, children who miss even a few minutes of the school day can miss out on vital aspects of the curriculum.

End of the day - School finishes at 3:05pm (Doors open from 3.00pm) (Mon,Wed,Thurs,Fri) and 3:30 only on Tuesdays starting 24/09/24. Please be prompt in collecting your child as Year 3 leave from the same doors at 3:10pm. Please wait outside of the hall/gym doors.

Penguins class leave through the hall on a Tuesday. Penguins leave through the link corridor all other days.

Seals class leave through the gym every day.

Please remember to let a member of staff or the school office know if someone different is coming to collect your child as if we do not know them, we will be unable to let your child leave with them. In this situation, we will contact you via telephone to gain your permission before allowing your child to leave the premises. Please do not be offended if this happens as we have to ensure all children are safely handed over to the appropriate adults at the end of the day.

Children in year 2 must be collected by someone over 16.

We will send text messages and Class Dojo messages to let you know when In Harmony is not on so please look out for them.

Uniforms and Coats - All children must wear school uniform at all times. A polite reminder that the uniform for Year 2 is a blue jumper/cardigan, a yellow polo shirt and black/grey trousers/skirt. Please make sure all uniform and coats are clearly labelled with your child's name.

Shoes—Please make sure your child is wearing sensible school shoes (i.e. NO heeled boots or shoes) and if they have laces, please teach them how to tie them themselves or alternatively make sure they wear Velcro shoes if they can't tie laces. This will help us greatly—Thank you.

Reading - Reading folders will be sent home every day and we ask that each child reads <u>every</u> night at home some/all of their book. Please make sure that your child's book folder is in school each day to allow members of staff to hear your child read. Reading is an important part of the curriculum and therefore we encourage you to spend time reading with your child and ask you to sign their reading record (yellow book) every time you do this.

If your child is reading Read Write Inc books, they will be changed after they have been read 3 times either at home or in school. This is to help your child gain fluency when reading. If your child has moved onto book banded books (Coloured sticker on spine of book) then these will be changed after they have been read once.

PE— Penguins have P.E. on a Tuesday every week. Seals have P.E. on a Tuesday every week.

Please remember to send your child into school with their trainers for the lesson. NO jewellery is to be worn for P.E.

P.E. is sometimes outdoors unless the weather is unsuitable for an outdoor lesson. We will remind you when to send in tracksuit bottoms for the lesson. Once the weather becomes warmer we will just wear our school P.E. kits if the lesson is outdoors but some days it may be too cold for t-shirts and shorts. We wear coats to walk to the P.E. area if it is cold and then the children are encouraged to leave them on for the lesson itself. If they get hot then they are allowed to take them off.

Jewellery— A reminder that the only earrings that are allowed to be worn in school are small stud earrings and these <u>MUST NOT</u> be worn on P.E. days. <u>Hoop earrings are not allowed to be worn at any time.</u> NO other jewellery should be worn.

**Homework** - Homework and spellings will be given on a Friday for both classes via Class Dojo. Spellings are posted on Class Dojo portfolios with instructions of the date of the spelling test.

Class dojo—We use Class dojo to send messages to all parents on our class story section. We are also posting homework instructions and spellings on there every week too. Please make sure you are regularly checking Class dojo so you don't miss out on important information.

Contact details—Please make sure we have up to date contact details at the office for your child e.g. the correct phone number for parents, up to date address etc. This is especially important in case your child is unwell or has an accident and we need to urgently contact you. We also use text messages to let you know important dates etc.
