We also created a PowerPoint presentation in Computing where we talked about these impacts and affects further.



We looked more closely at the impact on the economy and businesses and the job roles they create which bring money into the rainforest





We took part in the 'Road to RIAT' workshop in which we found out what 'sustainability' means. We also looked at different businesses such






as IKEA and Amazon and found out what they are doing to try and be more sustainable.
